

# Self-Guided Tour

## UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY. Self-Guided Tour



### 1. Gatton Student Center (B-2)

Often called the living room of campus, this \$201 million, state-of-the-art building is a hub for student involvement. It is home to the Visitor Center; the UK Bookstore; Champions Kitchen, an all-you-care-to-eat dining hall; the MLK Center and LGBTQ\* Resource Center; and Alumni Gym, one of two fitness centers on campus. It also holds retail dining options, student organizations and event spaces including the Worsham Cinema.

### 2. Main Building (B-3)

Main Building, formerly the Administration Building, is home to the Office of the President and other top-level administrators. It is one of the three original State College buildings completed in 1882 and the only one still standing.

### 3. Patterson Plaza (B-3)

Patterson Plaza is at the heart of campus. A statue honoring James Kennedy Patterson, the first president of the University of Kentucky, welcomes you to the academic core of campus. Patterson Office Tower rises over Patterson Plaza 18 stories high and is home to various student programs, many professors in the Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Social Work and the Martin School of Public Policy and Administration offices and Intermezzo Café.

### 4. White Hall Classroom Building (C-3)

White Hall Classroom Building has large theater-style seating classrooms on the first floor and smaller, more traditional sized classes upstairs. At an average of just 25 students per class, UK boasts small class size on a campus of 31,000 Wildcats.

### 5. Gatton College of Business and Economics Building (B-4)

With a \$65 million renovation and expansion, this college increased its square footage and faculty size. Gatton has its own career center, the Graham Office of Career Management, which helps students with professionalism, résumé services and the job hunt.

### 6. Engineering Complex (C-4)

Recognized as the only Top-100 ranked College of Engineering in Kentucky, freshman students

are able to explore all 10 available engineering disciplines before officially declaring their major through our First-Year Engineering program. The Ralph G. Anderson building is home to engineering advisors and Rising Roll Gourmet.

### 7. J. David Rosenberg College of Law (B-5)

After a \$56 million renovation and expansion, the Rosenberg College of Law was dedicated in Fall 2019. Featuring state of the art classrooms, a courtroom and Common Grounds Coffee House, our students have no objections to this facility!

### 8. Funkhouser Building (C-5)

Funkhouser Building is home to many offices including the offices of Undergraduate Admission, Campus Housing, Financial Aid and Scholarships, Student Account Services and the Transfer Center.

### 9. Jacobs Science Building (D-6)

The Jacobs Science Building is a three-story classroom and laboratory space that provides the latest technology for learning to our students. Built with support from UK Athletics, many classes in the College of Arts and Sciences are located here.

### 10. Johnson Center (G-7)

The Johnson Center houses hundreds of pieces of cardio, weight training and aerobics equipment; four indoor basketball courts, an indoor walking track; and the famous rock-climbing wall. Here, students can sign-up to work with a personal trainer or join an intramural sports team.

### 11. The 90 (F-5)

The 90 is a dining and student support facility home to restaurants such as the Fresh Food Company, Chick-fil-a, Papa John's, Zen Sushi and a Wildcat Pantry. This facility also contains offices for the Living Learning Program and classrooms.

### 12. William T. Young Library (E-5)

The William T. Young Library is the most popular place to study on UK's campus, even though it is one of nine libraries on campus. The library

contains moving bookshelves, two computer labs and more than 22 group study rooms. Students can also have their papers reviewed at the Writing Center or stop by Tech Help @ The Hub for any IT questions.

### 13. Greek Park (E-3)

Approximately 28 percent of UK students are involved in Greek life. Along Columbia Terrace, many of the sororities, and a few of the fraternities, have their houses. Participating in Greek life is a great option for involvement on campus, but certainly not the only one. There are more than 550 registered student organizations at UK or you can create another with three friends, a constitution and a faculty or staff advisor!

### 14. Maxwell Place (D-4)

The path around Maxwell Place not only serves as a shortcut leading from Central Campus to the main academic area, but the house serves as a home for our president, Dr. Eli Capilouto, and his wife. They live here 24/7, 365 days a year, but this path is always open to students. Grab a blanket and spend some time studying in the garden!

### 15. Singletary Center for the Arts (D-2)

The Singletary Center is adjacent to our College of Fine Arts and serves as the premier theatre for student dance, vocal and musical performances.

### 16. Memorial Coliseum and the Joe Craft Center (C-1)

The Big Blue Nation is known as one of the largest, most passionate fan bases in the country, and we don't limit that pride to just one sport. With 22 varsity sports, you can cheer on the Wildcats on the court, field or mat year-round! Memorial Coliseum serves as the home court for women's basketball, gymnastics and volleyball teams. Stop by the lobby of the Craft Center to see our eight men's basketball national championship trophies.

#### Academic Core

Located in the heart of campus, the Academic core - and its long sidewalk (nicknamed the "landing strip" for its likeness to an airport runway) that runs from the Funkhouser Building to Bowman, the Wildcat statue - is where students spend a lot of their time. Along this sidewalk are Pence Hall, home to the College of Design, and Grehan Building, the original home for the College of Communication and Information. After Grehan was renovated to become a part of the College of Engineering, CI found its new home at Blazer Dining.

#### Academic Medical Center and UK Chandler Hospital

Established in 1957, UK HealthCare is the brand name for the University of Kentucky's health care system. UK HealthCare represents the hospitals, clinics, outreach locations and patient care services and activities of the university's six health profession colleges (Medicine, Nursing, Health Sciences, Public Health, Dentistry and Pharmacy). The flagship of the more than 80 specialized clinics, 143 outreach programs and 9,000 health care providers operated by UK Healthcare is the UK Albert B. Chandler Hospital's Pavilion A. This landmark facility serves the Commonwealth with state-of-the-art care. The Chandler Hospital has been ranked the #1 hospital in Kentucky five years in a row.

#### Agricultural Science Building North

Agriculture touches every part of our lives, from the clothing we wear, the food we eat, the clean running water we enjoy and the medications we take. With 18 undergraduate degree programs, 16 graduate degree programs and more than 30 student organizations, this college has something for everyone.
